And so my message to you is "How How" and thank you with all my heart.





Committees at LAJF

Our vibrant and active committee structure is of enormous value to the Camp Rising Sun program and business of LAJF. Alumni of all ages participate on committees. Through the use of technology, international representation is increasing. Contact Judy Fox at jfox@lajf.org if you would like to be considered for membership on a committee.



Committee on Advancement (COA)

The COA worked closely with the staff this year to help develop and support new fundraising initiatives. This committee also advises the staff on matters related to alumni relations and communications.

Audit Committee

The Audit Committee reviews the financial statements and the IRS Form 990. Members interview the auditors about the financial processes and procedures in place and employed by the LAJF staff. This committee is currently seeking members who are accounting professionals.

Building and Grounds Committee

The B & G Committee (pictured above) has helped manage facilities maintenance at Red Hook and Clinton. Over the past year, we have refinished the walls and floors in the Old House at Red Hook. At Clinton we have installed a new roof on the campers' lounge and new siding on the back of the gym. A major undertaking this coming year will be the digging of a new well at Red Hook.

Committee on Directors (COD)

The COD nominates prospective Board members, orients newly elected Board members, leads the Board through its annual self-evaluation and oversees the Board's professional development.

Finance and Investment Committee (F&I)

F & I is responsible for advising the Board on the budget and recommending investment policy. This committee monitors the endowment portfolio which has profited from market conditions and good investment decisions in the last year.

George E. Jonas Scholarship Committee

Each year, several alumni are awarded GEJ Scholarships which are sustained by a specific fund within our endowment. This committee reviews applications and selects scholarship recipients.

Health and Safety Committee (H&S)

H & S is comprised of a number of medical professionals who represent a range of specialties. Last year, the H & S Committee revised and updated the Health and Safety Manual for camp which was well received and commended by the Dutchess County Health Department.

Program Committee

This active committee functions with two subcommittees. The Curriculum group reviews the camp program as it exists and how it's delivered. The Evaluation group deals with program assessment, evaluation and long term outcomes.

Selection Policy Committee

Selection Policy has been active this year thinking about representation of local cultures among our campers. Members of this committee work with selectors to facilitate communications and feedback. There is representation on this committee from both the U.S. and the international community.

Strategic Planning Committee (SPC)

This committee recently completed a two-year strategic plan, focusing on financial sustainability and alumni outreach. This plan was submitted to and adopted by the Board in September, 2010. The SPC will continue to monitor progress toward the objectives of that plan.

So, now I can see that sometimes your country is not too important for you, but when you enter another world, you can see how much you love your country. So, I'm glad to say: I am Peruviaaannnn.

This year, the Outcomes Survey in which 610 of you participated three years ago, was analyzed and reconfigured into a manuscript that, for the first time, scientifically assesses the qualita- Here is an excerpt from the recently completed tive impact of CRS.

When one reads our "Beings and Doings," it is obvious that an inordinate proportion of CRS alumni enter vocations or accept volunteer commitments that reflect social consciousness and a desire to help improve the lives of others. Yet few outside our CRS community are aware of the power of our program and its enduring influence. It is important for us to learn about ourselves and for others to learn about us because:

- CRS can serve as a model for other programs that help young people attain excellence.
- Applicants should be aware of the extraordinary opportunity CRS represents.
- CRS should be a more broadly recognized educational program.
- Universities and employers should understand the value added to a candidate for admission or employment as a result of CRS.
- Donors to LAJF and CRS should know that their contributions to the program help build a better world.



CRS alumni should know that they are part of a unique community that is based on enduring principles that express themselves in the betterment of humanity.

manuscript on Outcomes.

Among responding alumni from all over the world, an overwhelming majority endorsed the experience as strongly formative. Of the respondents, 98% (N= 598/610) described the experience in a positive way ranging from positive to life changing. In this cohort who were highly educated and successful, a large majority attributed much of their life success to this camp experience, and they acknowledged a substantial influence on numerous domains of personal development to include tolerance, global awareness, self-confidence, and leadership effectiveness.

You are part of something important and unique. Going forward, we are developing a more robust and systematic evaluation of the CRS program. We will continue to survey our alumni, we will be conducting pre-post-camp studies, and we will be collecting longitudinal effectiveness data. We will be disseminating this information to the educational community and more broadly in the regions where our alumni live and work. We welcome your ideas with this multi-dimensional project about how to demonstrate the impact of the Camp Rising Sun program. Most important, we need your continued support and participation in any survey queries we send out to you. An honest assessment depends upon maximal participation from our alumni.

My Maple Syrup Adventure

Have you ever wondered what goes on at our camps during the long, cold winter in Rhinebeck?

A report from CRS Clinton from Cameron Rylance, Facilities Manager, '07-'10



After a nice warm weekend I came to work Monday morning, Valentine's Day, ready to begin my first adventure in creating maple syrup from the Sugar Maples growing throughout Clinton. I tapped 25 trees on Tent Hill and by the Peace Circle. Over the next five days I collected 50 gallons of raw sap

and on Saturday I started my boil-down. I knew it would take 10 - 12 hours so I brought some supplies and was prepared to camp out.

I lit the fire in our homemade evaporator around

10:00 am. Everything was going great. Fourteen hours later, at midnight, it started to snow. I dealt with the weather until 1:30 am when I added the last of my sap to the pan. I slept in the shop for a couple of hours

until 7:00 am. I woke up and finished the sugaring on a propane burner. After some spillage and boiling over, a couple of burns on my hands and arms, and some trial and error, I got the syrup finished, filtered and bottled. It tastes AWESOME! I bottled 12 half pints and can't wait to start another boil-down next week.

Editor's note: Since Cameron's first adventure he has bottled two more harvests. One half pint of this "nectar of the gods" brought in \$200 for CRS 2011 at auction at a gathering of the NY Society of Clinton Women and another half pint was auctioned off for \$50 at the LAJF Open House. Stretch your body and transform your mind

An ARISE Project in Latvia with Ilze Jece '08-'09

My first encounter with Camp Rising Sun was as wellness counselor in Denmark in 2008 and 2009, introducing girls to alternative medicine, holistic self-care and loads of yoga



exercises. Being inspired by CRS aims and the well-established worldwide movement in this field, I was very excited to create an activity where I could use both my CRS experience and other skills and passions in my local community.

My four-month project was to create a holistic training experience for young women from Ilguciems Women Prison and Maras Crisis Center. I taught basic peacemaking practices including yoga, non-violent communication, mindful awareness, conscious social action and "doing good." Each week we practiced yoga exercises to keep fit and healthy, engaged in conversations about peaceful and sustainable living and participated in practical

and inspiring workshops on social action and personal development. For many, this was their first opportunity to receive personal attention and explore the connecting and healing effect of touch.

This was also my first experience working with women in crisis and female prisoners. I was delivering workshops for women whose life stories I could never fully understand. Some had committed crimes, many had scars covering their

bodies and there was fear, anger and distrust in their eyes. I had to learn to let go of any judgments, keeping an open mind and holding a space for the women to be free to be themselves.

I was excited to have a very talented camper, Ruta Kergalve '09, join in the project. Her comments: "A million thoughts were running through my

head while waiting to enter the prison. It felt like it was a different world behind the walls. In the beginning I didn't know how I should communicate. Then I played a few songs, and we learned few songs together. Music always breaks the ice. It was a nice feeling to see how really interested they were. It's amazing to see how one person can change in different situations. The person who was shouting and laughing very loud in the beginning became very peaceful. In the end it was easy to forget where I was, because the atmosphere had become completely different, more relaxed and eniovable. It felt like something had changed in good way even in me. I think it's a great emotional healing, that is really needed for prisoners. I could see it in their eyes in our last meeting. There was sadness but also a joy and gratefulness for having this opportunity.'

I cannot say that I helped to transform the life of any of these women. It was only my intention to spread seeds and see if new ideas might somehow enter their hearts and minds. These things we shared, experienced, practiced would help them make a decision to live with integrity, to think more deeply, to love oneself with strength and not let

This project taught me that life is to be enjoyed and shared with people you love, celebrating your community and being radically kind and compassionate to yourself and fellow beings in this world.



I plan to keep working with young female prisoners and I thank ARISE for the opportunity to start this initiative here in Latvia. I encourage everyone to go outside and help anyone or anything. Sharing your privilege to be human and humane is enough to better the world through deeply and honestly connecting to yourself and others, serving your community and celebrating human spirit.



Contributions and Grants... \$370,792.......28%


Investment Income....... \$222,125.......16%

Putting the "I" in Leadership



I think of camp almost every day.

The reason is that every time I meet new people, their first question is, "Where is the accent from?" and the second question is "How did you get here all the way from Bulgaria?" The answer is: I went to an international summer leadership camp in NY while I was a high school student from Bulgaria.

I have been humbled and overwhelmed by all the achievements my many friends from CRS have reached 10, 15 or 17 years after camp. CRS alumni are truly exceptional and are changing the world in beautiful ways. I can only imagine what they all will do in another 10, 15 or 17 years! And of course, the power and passion of our camp friendships is indescribable.

To me, the most impressive characteristic of CRS Clinton is the cultivation of girls into young women and independent strong individuals. Among all the important reasons to sustain CRS in the future, this for me is by far the most crucial.

A year ago, I joined the Finance and Investment Committee at LAJF as a way to start "paying CRS back" for all the great gifts it gave me.

First, I learned that this is an extremely transparent organization – alumni are welcomed at the regularly scheduled Board meetings, and are encouraged to volunteer on LAJF's committees.

Second, the financial decisions of the Foundation are made carefully and deliberately, and require full consensus.

Third, the most important goal facing this organization today is our approach to fundraising. While the F&I committee will work its magic to earn handsome returns on the endowment, returns alone cannot sustain us indefinitely. In fact, consistent and meaningful donor contributions are key to the continued healthy operation of the two camps.

My husband (not a CRS alumnus but wishes he were) and I agreed to make CRS our most important contribution in 2011. I also sought out Goldman Sachs' corporate sponsorship, which will match my 2011 gift in full. The goal that the three of us, my husband, my employer and I, had was to sponsor one Clinton girl in 2011. As you may know, each camper costs approximately \$10,000. To make the math work, we will contribute \$5,000 and GS will match with another \$5,000.

I'd like to invite all CRS alumni to join me in this commitment to CRS today and in the future. Please make CRS your most important charitable donation this year and in the coming years. That way we can all continue to enjoy the gifts it gives to young women and men in the US and from around the world (including Bulgaria!).

In 1988, I was a naïve 15 year old from rural Utah. I was Mormon, one of thirteen children, and my family didn't own a television. I think the only reason I was selected for Camp, was that I represented such an extreme stereotype of a kid from the "sticks."

I am one of those people whose life was completely transformed by going to camp.

When I learned there was to be no 2009 season at CRS, I felt like a piece of my heart was torn out. I felt real grief, to think that some young kid, from the back of nowhere, would not be receiving this incredible, transformative gift. I promised myself that I would do whatever I could do, personally, to ensure that CRS continues, so that there would be a 2010 season, and 2011, and many more after that.



I wrote a check to LAJF for \$5,000, the largest charitable donation I have ever made. I joined the Committee on Advancement, and I began reaching out to the campers from my year. Last summer, I participated on the Visit Team.

All of this activity has been personally rewarding and has also renewed my faith and optimism about the future of the Foundation. I've been so impressed with the LAJF Board, the volunteers and staff. This really is a committed, selfless group of people.

However, I will say that involving myself in the Foundation has also made me realize that if LAJF is to succeed, and restore itself to financial health, it will take much more than the talents of these extraordinary individuals. It will require ALL of us, working together toward this common goal. In my view, each of us, who has been blessed by having the gift of camp in our lives, must work to ensure this amazing gift for a future generation of campers.

I'm working toward giving back to the Foundation an amount equal to the gift given to me. I do this



because I know the world is a richer place for organizations like Rising Sun, and because it is my turn to begin giving.





In Memoriam

LAJF extends our deepest sympathy to the family and friends of these CRS alumni

Robert Ayers Barnet '35-'36 of Champaign, IL died on January 20. A native of Staten Island, NY, he attended the Taft School in CT and Williams College, then graduated from Rutgers Univ. Bob served in the Navy during WWII and went on to work for US Fidelity and Guaranty followed by Marsh & McClellan and Chicago State Univ. He then worked at the Univ. of Illinois until retirement in 1988. Bob was a longtime member of the Unitarian Universalist Church, Urbana-Champaign.

Luwe Harm Beijerman '59 died on June 19, 2010 at age 67. He had been a physician in Werkendam for over 30 yrs. From the CRS Dutch Alumni Association: Luwe was a camper in 1959 and since then was an affectionate member of the Rising Sun family. Through the years he was closely involved with the Dutch selection and alumni activities. Per Bergsjø '48, '53 died on July 27, 2010 at 78 years of age. He was wellrespected in the medical field for his publications and many contributions in the areas of women's health. From Per's daughter, Berit: My brothers and I grew up with my father telling us about his happy days at Camp Rising Sun, and he would even sing songs from the play he had a role in at the camp. The time he spent there and the people he met obviously made a big impression on him. The death of my father came as a terrible shock because it happened so unexpectedly. He was a good father, loved his grandchildren and was immensely proud of them. He was very intelligent, knew so much and was always kind to everybody he met. He was still very active both professionally and physically. He rode his bike every day to his office in town, and was cross-country skiing in the winter and hiking in the mountains in the summer.


Pete Seeger '35

The work of Dart Society fellows who covered the earthquake in Haiti last January was compiled in a video presented at the 2010 conference of the International Society of Traumatic Stress Studies (ISTSS). The video, "My Heart is Breaking in Haiti: Journalists Explain Why," was created by Frank Ochberg, MD, and features the voices of journalists describing the emotional impact of covering the catastrophe. In all the voices there is a grasp of the journalists' awareness of their professional and human concern for the victims and the country, but it is the expertise of their coverage of tragedy that enables viewers and other journalists to connect as a caring community. The video documents how these journalists managed the story psychologically, and is a teaching tool for those who have yet to bridge the personal-professional di-

vide, that of journalist as human being.

Frank is one of the founders of ISTSS and Chairman Emeritus of the Dart Center. For 11 years, journalists have attended ISTSS to learn about trauma science, to improve their craft and hone their sensitivities to the demands of covering catastrophic events.
